Movin' and Groovin' at the Pocono Mountains Community Fundraiser

More than 220 generous supporters and sponsors dined and danced at the "sneaker chic" Movin' and Groovin' event, which featured a taste of the Poconos from 20 participating restaurants and bakers. The fundraiser's third foodfest style event gave away more than \$100,000 to three well-deserving nonprofits. Monroe County Meals

on Wheels received \$45,625. Pocono Services for Families and Children took home \$45,000. Sights for Hope received a check for \$10,000.

With over \$3.1 million in cumulative funds raised since 2004, the Community Fundraiser continues to be Monroe County's largest single-event fundraiser. In partnership with presenting sponsors AllOne Charities, Highmark BlueCross BlueShield, event-host Mount Airy Casino Resort, and 28/22 News (including event emcee Candice Kelly), the fundraiser is Sanofi's CSR



and philanthropy signature event in the Poconos.

AllOne CEO John Cosgrove summed it up well, first paraphrasing Nelson Mandela: "There can be no more keen revelation of the soul of a society than in the way it treats its neighbors.' So, I think tonight is a perfect articulation of this community. We all come together to make sure that our children, our elder citizens, our neighbors with visual differences, are all taken care of."
