## Adopt-a-Family Campaign Delivers Holiday Cheer Where Needed Most

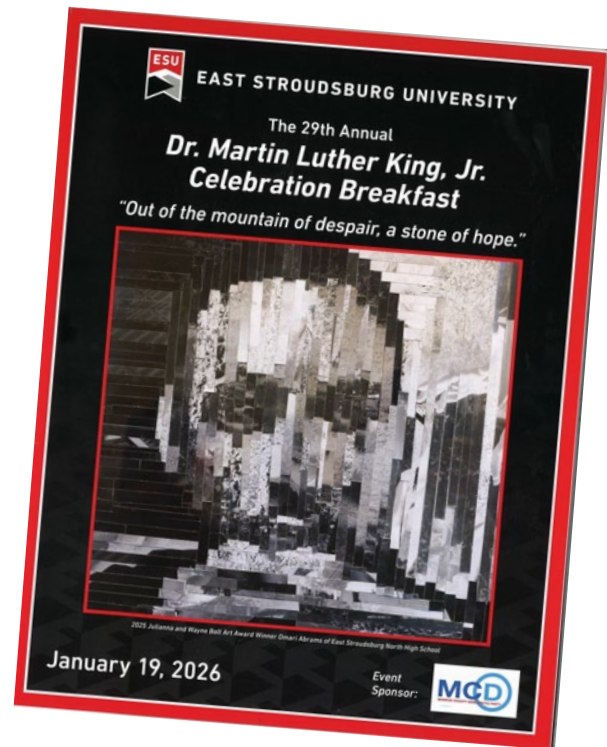
## Sanofi Joins Monroe County in Celebrating the Legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
